What is the Little 500?

The Little 500 is the biggest intramural event on the IU campus and the largest collegiate bike race in the United States. This weekend, riders will compete in four-person teams using one-speed Schwinn bicycles on a quarter-mile cinder track. The women's race is 100 laps and the men's race is 200 laps.

Going into its 60th year, the Little 500 boasts a tradition unlike any other college event. More than 25,000 people attend the races every year, with the proceeds used for working student scholarships. The 2009 races allowed the IU Student Foundation to give away more than \$35,000 in scholarships.

The activities are open to the general public and the races take place at Armstrong Stadium, located on N. Fee Lane, just north of E. 17th Street near the IU Pool. The women's race will be held on Friday, April 23 at 4:00 pm and the men's race will be Saturday, April 24 at 2:00 pm. Tickets can be purchased in advance at the IU Auditorium ticket office, 1100 E. 7th Street or at www.ticketmaster.com. Tickets can also be purchased at the gate on race day. Adult tickets are \$15 - \$20, children under 12 \$5.

The events of the Little 500 were dramatized in the 1979 movie *Breaking Away* which depicts a group of Bloomington townies who enter the race as the "Cutters" (from the local Indiana limestone stonecutters) to defeat the favored fraternity team.
