AREA POOLS

Most area pools are now open. There are two public pools operated by the city. They are open 11:00 - 7:00 pm each day. Admission rates are \$2.50 adults, \$2.00 youth (17 and under). You can also purchase economy passes for \$35 for 20 entries (adult or youth) or \$75 for 50 entries (adult or youth). These rates apply at the following pools:

- **Bryan Park** - 1100 S. Woodlawn, open 11:00 am - 7:00 pm daily
Zero-depth pool for young children, 2 waterslides, concessions
- **Mills Pool** - 1100 W. 14th Street, open 11:00 am - 7:00 pm daily
Zero-depth pool for young children, water slide, water basketball, picnic and concession area.
- **Indiana University Outdoor Pool**, located at 17th Street and Fee Lane is also open to the public for recreational swimming from 1:30 - 6:00 pm, daily. Lap swimming is also available 6:00 - 8:00 am Monday - Friday and noon - 6:00 pm daily. Cost is \$2.75 per admission.
