Visit French Lick - Located about an hour and 15 minutes south of Bloomington, this is a great afternoon or weekend trip. You can visit the Indiana Railway Museum and take a train ride, Big Splash Adventure Indoor Water Park, Indoor Go-Kart Track, see historic West Baden Springs Hotel and visit the French Lick Springs and casino. It's a nice drive and a chance to see some wonderfully renovated old hotels restored to their original beauty.

AREA POOLS

There are two public pools operated by the city. They are open 11:00 - 7:00 pm each day. Admission rates are \$2.50 adults, \$2.00 youth (17 and under). You can also purchase economy passes for \$35 for 20 entries (adult or youth) or \$75 for 50 entries (adult or youth). These rates apply at the following pools:

- **Bryan Park** - 1100 S. Woodlawn, open 11:00 am - 7:00 pm daily
Zero-depth pool for young children, 2 waterslides, concessions
- **Mills Pool** - 1100 W. 14th Street, open 11:00 am - 7:00 pm daily
Zero-depth pool for young children, water slide, water basketball, picnic and concession area.
- **Indiana University Outdoor Pool**, located at 17th Street and Fee Lane is also open to the public for recreational swimming from 1:30 - 6:00 pm, daily. Lap swimming is also available 6:00 - 8:00 am Monday - Friday and noon - 6:00 pm daily. Cost is \$2.75 per admission.

RESOURCES

YMCA W.I.S.E Program - Working Out to Increase Strength and Endurance - this program is designed specifically for those who are undergoing treatment for cancer. The cost is just \$15 per month and includes a wide variety of class times, making it very convenient for MPRI patients. Before each class, participants are weighed in; have their resting EKG, heart rate, and blood pressure taken. The session begins with group stretching and moves into an individual aerobic session. Participants may swim, walk, jog, bicycle, row or use the weight room equipment depending on the individual prescription written by the Exercise Specialist or Nurse at the YMCA and approved by the Medical Directors. The sessions end with a slower paced cool-down. Spouses or other interested family members are encouraged to participate with you.
