**IMPORTANT TRAFFIC INFORMATION – PLEASE READ:** You can expect continued traffic delays along the 45/46 Bypass over the next two weeks. IU classes begin on August 29 and for those who will be living in dorms, the move-in day is August 24. This will create major delays along the bypass. Traffic will move much slower as we have many people traveling through who are not familiar with the area. Even for those of us who travel this route every day, the changing lanes and access to Milo B. Sampson Lane are sometimes difficult to navigate. We are working with IU to try to get additional signage for Milo B. Sampson Lane that is more visible. Also, if you have been using the Patient Center driveway, it is no longer accessible.

Please use caution as you drive in this area and **allow extra time for delays to arrive at your scheduled appointment time.**

An alternate route to avoid travel on 45/46 Bypass: Take N. Walnut Street to Glendora Drive (just past McDonald's), turn right on Glendora Drive, turn left on Dunn Street, right on Tamarack Trail (this will take you past Jill's House), follow Tamarack through Meadowood Retirement Center to the Proton Center.
