## Aug 6 – Aug 12, 2010

As we near the start of classes in our local schools on August 18, you will notice a dramatic increase in the amount of traffic in Bloomington and, particularly, along the 45/46 Bypass. As this is a direct route to several public schools, you can expect school buses and students driving to and from school which will add to the volume of traffic we now see on the bypass.

Indiana University students will also be flooding the area as classes begin on August 30. Those students who choose to live off campus in apartments will arrive between August 13 - 25. Move-in day at the IU dorms is Wednesday, August 25 so you can expect extreme traffic on and around this date. This could definitely impact your travel time to and from treatment. Also, area restaurants and hotels will be extremely busy. Please allow extra time for your commute around the city.

An alternate route that you may want to consider instead of traveling on 45/46 Bypass: Take N. Walnut Street to Glendora Drive (just past McDonald's), turn right on Glendora Drive, turn left on Dunn Street, right on Tamarack Trail (this will take you past Jill's House), follow Tamarack through Meadowood Retirement Center to MPRI.

She has also met with patients at our Monthly Nutrition Meeting held at the Patient Resource Center.
