## **THINGS TO DO**

**IU Outdoor Pool** - located at E. 17th and Fee Lane, will remain open through October 3 - Lap swimming in the heated pool is open Mon/Wed/Fri, 6:00 - 8:00 am, daily noon - 6:00 pm, Mon - Thurs, 8:00 - 10:00 pm, Sat/Sun, noon - 6:00 pm.

**T.C. Steele State Historic Site** - located between Bloomington and Nashville at 4220 T.C. Steele Road, open Tuesday - Saturday, 9:00 - 5:00 pm and Sunday, 1:00 - 5:00 pm, admission \$3.50 adults, \$3 for 55 and older, \$2 for children 12 and under. The T.C. Steele State Historic Site includes the last home and studio of Indiana artist Theodore Clement Steele (1847-1926). Steele was an American impressionist painter who was attracted to Brown County by the scenery he encountered while hiking in the area. The site's 211 acres of wooded hills and ravines inspired the artist to paint some of his most famous works.

**Sisters of Benedict** - 802 E. 10th Street, Ferdinand, IN, guided tours Tuesday - Sunday. Monastery Immaculate Conception, Ferdinand, IN was founded in 1867 and is one of the largest communities of women in the United States. The monastery's architectural magnificence has earned it the name "Castle on the Hill". The heart of the monastery is the church, listed in the National Register of Historic Places.

**Giant snake exhibit** – IU Geology Building, 1001 E. 10<sup>th</sup> Street (west end of 1<sup>st</sup> floor), Monday – Friday, 8:00 – 6:00 pm, free, public welcome. A cast of Earth's largest snake on record is on display through October 1. It is believed to have measured 43 feet from snout to tail tip and to have weighed 2500 pounds.
