Bluespring Caverns – Myst’ry River Voyage – 1459 Bluespring Caverns Road, Bedford (directions at www.bluespringcaverns.com), open every day 9:00 – 5:00, \$14 adults, \$8 children 3 – 15. This hour-long boat tour is piloted by a tour guide along the course of a subterranean river for over a mile, pointing out native rare blind fish and crayfish in their natural setting and explaining the natural forces that are yet at work creating great chambers below the rolling hills.
